- Boys State or Girls State Scholarship (NSU Award) \$200/semester for four years

2. Academic Credit (by ACT Test scores, AP scores or CLEP scores)

Students can earn college credit to Northwestern State University through various means including their scores on the ACT test, AP scores or CLEP Scores. Below are scores that students must obtain to receive academic credit.

A. ACT Scores

Math 27 – 29 – Credit given for Math 1020 (3 hours)

Math 30 – 36 – Credit given for Math 1020 and Math 1090 (6 hours)

English 28 – 31 – Credit given for English 1010 (3 hours)

English 32 – 36 – Credit given for English 1010 and English 1020 (6 hours)
